COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Business Transacted by the Board at the May Meeting.

The Board of County Commissioners met at Dayton, May 6, 1907; all members present.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

It was ordered that the townsite of Meyers Addition, signed by T. J. A. Flaws, August 29, 1906, as also the townsite of Central Addition, signed for approval, April 15, 1907, be approved and confirmed of the dates set forth and upon the payment of all fees be filed and recorded in the office of the County Recorder. It was ordered that all townsites hereafter must first be filed with the County Clerk to be considered by the County Commissioners.

The Commissioners ordered that the Barton Addition to the city of Yerington be accepted and placed on record.

The bills allowed appear in another column of this issue.

The quarterly report of Justice of the Peace Carter, of Mason Valley, was received and ordered filed.

The monthly reports of Clerk, Recorder and Jailor was read and filed.

A recess was taken to May 8. After convening the following business was transacted:

The Sheriff was ordered to collect a tax of \$2 on all dogs in unincorporated towns in the county.

A. Tamagni was granted a permit to place his two minor children in the Orphans' Home at Carson, after furnishing a sufficient bond.

The granting of a franchise to the Yerington Water Co. to lay pipes in the city of Yerington was laid over.

The following bills were laid over: C. C. Turner, salary and mileage; Mack & Farrington, lawyers' fees in suit of Lyon vs. Storey counties.

The following bills were reduced and allowed: J. R. Millsap, work on road, from \$104 to \$102.50; D. W. Roberts, work on road, from \$76.50 to \$72; W. R. Millsap, work on road, from \$57, to \$52.50; F. W. Fairbanks, printing and publishing, from \$180.50 to \$171.50; J. A. Carter, Justice fees, from \$72.50 to \$66.50.

J. A. Carter, Justice of the Peace of Mason Valley, tendered his resignation, which was accepted. W. N. Wood, of Yerington, was appointed to fill the vacancy, after filing a bond of \$1,000.

The map of the townsite of Morningstar was received and ordered filed.

Franchises for a telephone line from Wabaska to Yerington, applied for by J. M. Benham and H. Hironymous, was presented. On motion the matter was laid over until next meeting.

The petition to open up and lay out a public highway over the lands of J. B. Gallagher, D. Paquint and Mrs. H. Hayes below and east of the city of Yerington was laid over until the next meeting so that Commissioners Martin and Strosnider could investigate the proposed route.

C. C. Braun, of Dayton, was awarded the contract to furnish supplies to the poor farm for the next six months.

It was ordered that the county print-

ing be awarded to the LYON COUNTY TIMES for the month of May, 1907.

The returns of the city election of Yerington were canvassed and the following officers found to be elected:

Mayor, J. G. R. Smith; Councilmen, First Ward, C. W. Gallagher and E. J. Ross; Councilmen, Second Ward, O. H. Sonne and John Snyder; Clerk, W. F. Powers.

E. T. Powers presented his resignation as County Recorder and ex-officio Auditor to take effect June 6, 1907, was read. The resignation was accepted. The Board appointed Charles A. McLeod to fill the vacancy. His bonds were placed at \$5,000, with sureties to qualify for double the amount.

Board adjourned to June 6, 1907.

POWER LINE SLOW

Foreman Wright, of the Truckee River General Electric Co., was in here last week. He reports that it is impossible to find teams in Nevada to haul the poles for the electric power line to their destination. He also reports labor scarce, and thinks he will have to send to Utah or California for men and teams to do the work of stringing the power line. The company expected to be in here by the first of this month, but will not be here now, probably, before the middle of next month. Several business houses about Yerington have been wired this week so that when the juice gets here they can utilize it at once for lights. Messrs. Broili and B. C. Condit of the same company were also in this week and state that the line will reach the Nevada-Douglas in three weeks and the town ten days later. The TIMES contracted with them for a motor to run its machinery.
