

MR. BROILI TALKS ON A LIGHT QUESTION

Superintendent F. O. Broili of the Truckee River General Electric Light Company was an arrival in Yerington Wednesday evening to inspect the work being done in this district.

Recently a Salt Lake paper printed an article to the effect that Mr. Broili's company had taken more contracts for electricity in Yerington and vicinity than it could deliver. The story was called to the attention of Mr. Broili by a representative of the Times. In reply he stated that there was absolutely no truth in it and further that his company could at all times, barring accidents caused by the elements, furnish enough electric power to furnish heat, light and power for the Yerington district.

"The report" said Mr. Broili, "undoubtedly originated as a result of our inability to furnish complete service to all the towns as a result of the recent storm which temporarily demoralized our plant. We have, at all times, a reserve of 2,000 horse-power. Now, if necessary, we can turn that reserve into Yerington from which it may be seen that there need be no cause for alarm."

"When do you expect to have the city of Yerington lighted?" was asked.

"We figure that in two weeks everything will be in readiness to turn on the current. Our undertaking here is a large one and in addition we have been greatly handicapped by the non-arrival of certain necessary material. However, we are more than anxious to get into action here and will do so at the earliest possible time."

REPORTS A BIG LEAD STRIKE

W. H. Hurst is in from Yerington with a story of a big lead strike which he claims has been made in the Violet group of six claims adjoining the Western Nevada Copper Company's property on the west. At 27 feet deep, he says, there is 14 feet of ore that assays 40 per cent lead, \$16.20 gold, \$1.15 in silver, 1 to 5 per cent copper and 12 per cent iron. The claims are owned by Mr. Hurst, Leo Rothschild of Morningstar, and J. P. Lyons of the Ludwig. Mr. Hurst says the Nevada-Douglas Company has offered a premium of \$2 a ton on this ore if a five-year contract for the output can be secured.

After giving this information Mr. Hurst went out and brought in what he said was a sample of the ore struck in the property. It is a remarkably fine specimen of hematite of iron and evidently has not a trace of iron in it. -- Salt Lake Herald.
